

Camille Antinori is a research economist and currently visiting scholar at the University of California, Berkeley. Her focus on common property and collective action stems from her dissertation on the organization of community forestry operations in Oaxaca, Mexico where she conducted the first large-N cross-sectional survey and analysis of common property forest management schemes. She has continued this research as academic coordinator of the national survey project for Mexican community forestry, which covers other major forestry states in Mexico. Other recent research includes the transaction costs of carbon markets at the Lawrence Berkeley National Laboratory Energy Analysis Division. She completed her PhD in Agricultural and Resource Economics at the University of California, Berkeley, in 2000. Prior, she received a masters degree from the London School of Economics, where her masters thesis focused on dispute resolution in the Third United Nations Conference on the Law of the Seas.
